

Celeb chef José Andrés opening Spanish ‘Eataly’ at Hudson Yards

Shake Shack king Danny Meyer is no longer in talks to open a massive Hudson Yards food hall — and celebrity chef José Andrés has taken over and closed the deal, sources tell The Post. Andrés has agreed to launch a 35,000-square-foot, Spanish-themed food hall at 10 Hudson Yards, just under the High Line at 30th Street and 10th Avenue.

“It will be like [Italian-themed food hall] Eataly ... but different. It’s more than a food hall,” a source said.

The space will feature all sorts of Spanish concepts, from slightly formal to tapas, wine bars and more.

“Andrés is bringing in his Spanish friends, who will also be participating,” a source said.

The space is slated to open next year. And it will give Anthony Bourdain’s nearby food hall, which is set to open at Pier 57 in 2019, some competition.

Andrés, who was one of Time’s 100 most influential people in 2012, did not return calls at press time.
